## A HOSPITAL VISIT TO COLUMBIA ASIA HOSPITAL, AHMEDABAD



The final year students of Biomedical Engineering Department, at GPGA, visited to the renowned Columbia Asia Hospital, Ahmedabad, on 7th April, 2018. Total 30 students were accompanied by two faculty members of the department, Ms. J.H. Suthar and Ms. M.V. Singh. Aim of this visit was to provide practical exposure to the diagnostic and therapeutic equipments and learn about their features as well as their application areas. Asia Hospital, Mr. Nilesh Modi was kind enough to allow the students to visit important and normally restricted areas of the hospital. The students were lucky enough to witness some ongoing diagnostic and therapeutic procedures which allowed them to understand the operating procedures of some of the major equipments.

# Let's learn something new: The Shape-shifters...

A shape-memory alloy (SMA) is an alloy that can be deformed when cold but returns to its pre-deformed ("remembered") shape when heated. It may also be called memory metal, memory alloy, smart metal, smart alloy, or muscle wire . The two most prevalent shape-memory alloys are copper-aluminiumnickel and nickel-titanium (NiTi), but SMAs can also be created by alloy-

ing zinc, copper, gold and iron. Although iron-based and copper-based SMAs, such as Fe-Mn-Si, Cu-Zn-Al and Cu-Al-Ni, are commercially available and cheaper than NiTi, NiTi-based SMAs are preferable for most applications due to their stability and practicability. Shape-memory alloys are applied in medicine, for example, as fixation devices for osteotomies in orthopaedic surgery, as the actuator in surgical tools; active steerable surgical needles for minimally



invasive percutaneous cancer interventions in the surgical procedures such as biopsy and brachytherapy, in dental braces to exert constant tooth-moving forces on the teeth, in Capsule Endoscopy they can be used as a trigger for biopsy action.
